With this CALL FOR PAPERS AND POSTERS, we invite prospective authors and presenters to submit abstracts (maximum 200 words) of their research for the 2026 CTRF conference focused on "Mobilizing our Future: Transport Innovations for a Stronger Canada". Preference is given to relevant and thoughtfully developed applied research and policy recommendations related to the conference theme. However, abstracts, including those from academia, the private and public sectors, on matters relating to operational, technological, managerial and economic aspects of transportation, as well as policy issues including governance, regulation, safety, security and the environment, on all modes of transport, are all relevant and welcome.

#### Instructions

Submission of abstracts for the posters and papers this year will be done using the CTRF Sched Portal available at <a href="https://cfp.sched.com/speaker/4lViy3t9JF">https://cfp.sched.com/speaker/4lViy3t9JF</a>. Authors will need to create an account on the CTRF Sched Portal to make submissions by the dates given above.

Authors who wish to present their work at the conference but do not wish to submit a full paper (4000-4500 words) may submit a short paper (1200-1800 words) through the conference paper abstract and submission website. Authors must indicate in their abstracts the type of paper (full paper or short paper) that they will be submitting, or if their abstract is for a poster submission.

All papers will be published in a pre-conference set of Proceedings. In order to have a paper published in the Conference Proceedings, the author (at least one author in the case of joint authorship) must register for the full conference by the date indicated above and present the paper / poster at the conference. Authors will be responsible for supplying their poster in the requested format (note: recommendations on local printers can be provided). CTRF will continue its tradition of awarding prizes for the best conference papers and posters. Please note that short papers will not qualify for any award.

# **Copyright Notice**

Author(s) retain copyright for papers published in the CTRF Conference Proceedings. However, by submitting a paper to CTRF, the author(s) automatically grant CTRF the right to publish the submitted work online and in print form, as well as to reproduce, distribute, and sell the submitted work in print form or any other medium.

#### **Use of Large Language Models and Generative AI**

Any use of AI tools to generate text, images or graphics in your paper, or to collect, generate or analyze data, must be described in the Materials and Methods section of the paper. The tool used must be named and its application described. Authors are responsible for validating the information generated, and providing full citations. Avoiding plagiarism remains the responsibility of the author. AI bots such as ChatGPT **shall not** be acknowledged as authors.

### **Abstract and Paper Format**

For both papers and posters, abstracts may be up to 200 words in length and include up to four (4) key words. Abstracts, papers and posters must be submitted as per the key dates listed above, using the CTRF Sched Portal. If accepted, all papers and posters must adhere to the formatting instructions provided.

At CTRF's discretion, some abstracts may be placed on the CTRF website to promote the conference.

## **Conference Program**

In addition to the presentation of research papers, the Conference Program will feature a number of Plenary Sessions on the conference theme and current topics of interest, keynote speakers, technical tours (site visits), poster session(s), research committee meetings, workshops, as well as our annual Oxford-style Debate, a delightfully entertaining CTRF tradition.

#### **Conference Location and Venue**

CTRF's 61<sup>st</sup> Annual Conference will be held at the Four Points Sheraton Hotel in Halifax, with organizational partnership with the Dalhousie University's Transportation Collaboratory (DalTRAC) research facility.
